













Export safeguards

It carefully monitors and regulates the export of cultural goods, preventing the illicit trade that could strip nations of their heritage. It's a pledge to keep our shared history intact and within its rightful borders.





European Parliament and Council of Europe Directive on the Return of cultural property

Bringing Treasures Home

Ever heard of the 6-month rule? Among its various provisions, this directive establishes the terms for the verification and return of cultural goods. Upon receiving notification of the discovery of an item, a country has a period of 6 months to ascertain whether the cultural property found in another EU country constitutes national heritage.





Council of Europe Convention on Offences relating to Cultural Property

Defenders of Heritage

The Convention signed in Nicosia is a shield against those who seek to exploit and harm our cultural heritage. It criminalizes offenses related to cultural property, sending a powerful message that Europe stands united against any attempts to tarnish or diminish the treasures that define its identity.
