Illicit archaeological excavation

also known as looting or unauthorized excavation, involves digging up archaeological sites and extracting artifacts without proper authorization or in violation of legal regulations.

- Destruction of archaeological sites
- Irreversible damage to layers and context
- Loss of cultural heritage

• Bulldozing, tunneling, uncontrolled digging

Erasure of valuable historical information
