The event will feature expert panel discussions, an hands-on workshop, and engaging dialogues to address the complex challenges these professionals face in their work.

The RITHMS project seeks to foster collaborative networks among conservator-restorers, law enforcement agencies, and cultural institutions. equipping heritage professionals adopt a proactive approach identifying and preventing illegal activities related to cultural property.

The event will culminate in formulating recommendations for EU policies. providing a pathway for enhanced support and guidance on this issue at the European level.
